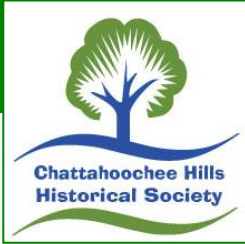


Meeting Minutes – August 7, 2008

Unfinished Business

- Website Update: Members were encouraged to send reports by e-mail to Laurie to be added to the website and to use the template for the first page.
- Paper copies of the template were provided for anyone needing one to print out reports. Members were encouraged to print out a paper copy of any reports and/or pictures for the “Heritage” Section to be created in the Rico Library. Also, it was encouraged the reports be saved on a flash drive and brought to monthly meeting to be downloaded in a folder on a computer in the Rico Library.
- It was unanimously agreed to postpone the proposed cemetery clean-up project until late fall or winter.
- Everyone present was asked to consider nominations for the Board of Directors for the Chattahoochee Hills Civic Association. Copies of the description of positions (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer) and duties as well as applications were available.
- Pictures and information on the Goodes “Friends and Neighbors Christmas Tree” was presented by Sandra to Paula for the Historical Heritage Tree Committee.
- It was recommended that a poster size map of the old roads be located and created to identify locations of places discussed in meetings.

New Business

- Sandra brought and displayed a flash drive and a digital voice recorder with USB connection and gave a description of how they can be used to collect, save, and share information.
- Paula reported on the Old Campbell County Historical Society meeting she attended. They have a tremendous amount of information we can use as a

resource about our area of Old Campbell County. The next meeting is Sunday, August 17th at 3:00 p.m. Members were encouraged to look at the website (located on the agenda).

- Paula reported on the Parks Committee “Buy Our Parks Now” campaign. There were questions and concerns regarding this effort. It was asked that answers and explanations to these questions and concerns regarding this issue be directed to the Parks Committee.
- A “Ramble” was presented by Buddy and Ginny Jarrard in conjunction with the Old Campbell County Historical Society September meeting on Saturday, Sept. 13th. A speaker will tell about the Creek Indians from the area at Council Bluff Pavilion on McIntosh Reserve. For further information, cost, and to make reservations see the Old Campbell County website or copies of the information that will be available at our next meeting.
- Paula has volunteered to create a CHHS Cookbook for a fund raising project. She has old recipe cards from women of the area. All members are to bring any old recipes from “past times” they have or can be collected to the next meeting. (Names to go with the recipes would be great.)
- We were informed by Carole that Sara Wilson, age 93, was moved to a nursing home (hopefully temporarily). Volunteers are needed to interview her for her stories.
- Everyone was encouraged to be working on a project. There was a discussion on the many “stores” that were located in the area and it will be added to the project list.

- Ken shared what he knew of the history of the H.L. Lloyd ball field.
- Questions were answered for Sandra on the location of “County Line” – now known as Redwine – and the location of the Varner Homeplace, “Boot Hill” cemetery, and Varner Town.
- Sara Ann shared old pictures of New Hope United Methodist Church and her report on the history of the church.
- Carole shared artifacts that have come into her possession from the family of Julius Cisero Watkins and his wife Alma Gullatt Watkins whose father was Otis Gullatt. Included in the huge amount of pictures and documentation was a handwritten description of the Gullatt house and area on Jones Ferry Rd.
